M5 Season Report

After the success of the 2016 season, the Westminster Metro 5 team went into the 2017 season confident we could replicate last year's success.

Although the squad had lost Chris Malec and Rohan Hocking and Joshna to the Metro 3 squad and Alex Davis to the exotic delights of Port Lincoln, we'd now got a full complement of Mitchells (Lucy, Tim, James and Hen) and new to the club, Steven Peterson, Lotte Vixseboxse and Amila Kushan. Tom Mullins, Aidan Galpin, James Peikert, Josh Megson, Jatinder Singh, Leigh Richardson, Daniel McGaffin, made up the balance of the squad, with occasional guest appearances from Chris and the Rohans, Aaron Billows, Philip Dick and the Benson boys.

The first game, against Seacliff, was a tight affair, with us winning courtesy of a lovely goal from Amila Kushan, and some solid defensive play to keep the result to 1-0. That result was followed by another 1-0 win over Grange and then by three more wins, so that a third of the way through the season, we were top of the league and looking strong.

Our forward line was further boosted by the arrival of Sheshan Rajapakse, who spent his first few weeks in green wondering whether the team he'd joined ever won a game. His first game saw us go down 2-1 to the lowly ranked Adelaide Uni, and that loss marked the start of our now traditional mid-season lull.

More improbable losses followed against teams who would score early then park the bus for the next 65 minutes or, more infuriatingly, would jag a couple of goals while we spend 70 minutes battering away at their defence.

In a bid to stem the flow of goals we conceded on the counter attack, we changed formation from a 2-3-5 to a slightly unconventional 2-3-3-2, which at times saw us playing some of the loveliest hockey but proved nonetheless not entirely successful. We only suffered one thrashing, against a team from Adelaide Hockey Club, which had dropped from Metro 3 to Metro 5 and contained some ageing but still capable players. It's worth noting here that while this AHC went on to take the flag, and finish top, Westminster were the only team to get a win against them this season.

While we kept our long losing streak alive, luck nonetheless seemed to favour us, as results around us meant that we were never really out of finals contention.

In a bid to turn things around, Matty Fuller stepped in. Although nominally taking a break from the game, Matty got the team concentrating on tactical awareness and discipline, and in doing so got the team back on focussed on the run in to the finals.

The losing streak, however, meant that run in needed us to succeed and not just others to fail. The last few games of the season fell out that the final game of the minor rounds, against Woodville, wasn't so much as must win, as a must't lose by more than 12 goals. What followed was the strangest game of hockey I can recall. With genuinely so little at stake for Woodville, they set out their stall to get something memorable from the game... in their case, to get more cards than goals, in which they succeeded.

Our loss to them notwithstanding, we did make the finals, and our first game was against Grange. Despite having the bulk of possession and the lion's share of the shots on goals, we somehow managed to contrive a 3-2 loss that ended our season. That said, the quality of our play, leaving aside the paucity of goals, bodes well for 2018.

Many thanks to Andrew, for all the hard work he put in as team manager across the season. Thanks also to Matty Fuller, for the mid-season reboot that got us over the finals line, and James Peikert for the beers and all of the other extra work he takes on, and everyone else on the committee and in and around the club who make it the unique, extraordinary club that it is. Congratulations to everyone involved in another solid season, and onwards and upwards for 2018.
